**LANDMARK SOCIETY AFRICAN-AMERICAN LANDMARKS INITIATIVE
SEEKS INPUT FROM COMMUNITY**

Public invited to Listening Sessions

(ROCHESTER, NY August 14, 2013) — The Landmark Society of Western New York is reaching out to the Rochester community to identify places that have been important in the lives of African-American residents in Rochester. The focus of this first phase is economic development.

“We are looking for locations where African-Americans have lived, worked and raised a family, the spot where an important event took place, a park, a school, a corner store, anywhere that you remember that was important to you at some time in your life,” said Larry Francer, Associate Director of Preservation for The Landmark Society.

The goal is to create a special interest in these places that will lead to greater neighborhood stabilization, save historic structures or sites, attract investment, inspire younger generations with identity and community pride and tell the story of people who came to Rochester and made a life, raised a family and formed a community. A few targeted locations will be chosen and grant funds will be directed for a feasibility study which could include cost estimates, use/reuse ideas, branding/placemaking/streetscaping concepts.

“Our experiences determine who we are and what we want,” said Sandy Frankel who co-chairs the committee with Bill Johnson. “The places in our lives reflect those values and connect us to each other and to our past. This project is an amazing opportunity for our community to explore, share and ultimately preserve our common heritage.”
